# **W**e Are People of Hope


In our year of *New Horizons*, we are reminded that we are people of hope. Pope Francis often speaks of Christian hope, drawing on the scriptures to explain this type of hope, something that is particularly significant as the season of Lent draws near.

**Lent is an important season of the Church's Liturgical calendar.** Beginning with Ash Wednesday, it is a season of self-reflection and prayer.

Lent is also a time of giving, of preparation, and a time of hope, hope that is renewed when we celebrate the resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday.

This year, Ash Wednesday will be observed on **Wednesday the 26**th **of February**. On this day many Christians will attend an Ash Wednesday Mass or service where they will receive ashes on their forehead in the form of a cross. This is a visible symbol of repentance and penance, and our desire to lead the life God intends for us.

Father Mick will celebrate Parish Mass on Ash Wednesday at 12pm and 6pm at St Patrick's Church; all are most welcome to attend.


We are happy to say we raised \$205 which will be going to Vinnies so that the money will stay within the community and help locals. Thank you to all the students and parents who supported this fundraiser.


















# **Kindergarten News**
