St Patrick's Parish School

Welcome back to our final term of 2026. The staff commenced with a professional development day led by Rev Dr Richard Leonard (Jesuit Priest). The themes of the day were three-fold — **Faith**, **Hope** and **Love**. Offering a leadership of Faith, Hope and Love, Catholic Education stands for meaning, interconnectedness, hope, spirituality, the soul and a passion for this world while we look for the next. Along with parishioners and staff from St Joseph's Bombala, our staff explored how our schools are meant to be places offering a sane faith, a sure hope and a deep love for God. Pope Francis designated 2025 to be the Church's Year of Hope.

1. The bible gives us 230 names for God and so there are many ways to know God and many places where God meets us in our complex realities. Bouncing off The Truman Show we explored how God does not send evil upon us but accompanies us as we are called us to freedom from our destructive moments into the joy of being forgiven and loved.



- 2. Every mental health indicator in Australia demonstrates that things are deteriorating quickly for young and old alike. We have never needed to **hope** more than now in something greater, something more enduring in this world and the next. If ever we needed an example of how much **hope** we should have in Christ's invitation to start again, we can reflect on the life St Paul who went from being a murderer to a missionary.
- 3. **Love** is the summary of Jesus' message because Jesus said so: love God; love your neighbour; and love yourself. Our staff explored how the pilgrimage of faith is meant to be a journey of love where we communicate, or pray with God to be the best witnesses we can in the world. Pope Francis showed us how real and practical our sacrificial love needs to be. Some of the feedback included:

Last week, we sent a **Uniform Survey** for parents to complete. The aim of our uniform review is to create a school uniform that instills pride in our students and school community, while being as functional, affordable, comfortable, and durable as possible. Our Uniform Committee will be reviewing and collating your feedback to provide a summary, so we can report back to the Senior Leadership Team on what we heard. Your input will help us seek samples for any changes to the uniform that can be considered for future implementation. Uniform pictures have been placed randomly through the survey to help with your responses. Already we have had close to 100 parents respond. This is encouraging as the Committee will meet and analyze the Survey results.

Well done to Ellie Reid (Year 6 student) on being awarded "Speaker of the Tournament". A special thanks to Mrs Menshic for coordinating this opportunity for our students. In the next week, we will be wishing our student teams in Tournament of Minds (Arts and STEM) every success as they represent us in the International Final in Sydney.

Thank you for your support with our Open Day held this week, followed by the Year 7 Information Evening in the Secondary Library. I know that our Grandparents and friends also appreciated the day and enjoyed visiting classes and sharing a picnic lunch.

"Shamrock's Journey - Past, Present, Future"

Mural Story & Symbolism

This mural is a visual narrative that weaves together the rich heritage, present identity, and future aspirations of our school community. At its heart is a shamrock, a symbol deeply rooted in Irish heritage, Catholic tradition, and a unifying emblem for our school.

Each of the three leaves represents different dimensions of our story; past, present, and future. Together they reflect the unity and diversity within our school. In the centre and stem of the shamrock our school's crest flows into the three leaves, grounding the mural in our shared identity and mission.

The Shamrock Leaves: Past, Present, Future

First Leaf – The Past

This leaf honours our history and heritage. It features imagery of St Patrick's Church, St Patrick, and the St Brigid's Cross, representing the spiritual and cultural foundations upon which our school was built. These symbols remind us of the values and traditions that continue to guide us.

Second Leaf - The Present

Here, we see various orientations of the convent and surrounds, symbolising how the past is carried into the present. The blending of old and new reflects our evolving identity, rooted in tradition but responsive to change. It's a celebration of our current community; students, staff, and families, who live out our values daily. The flowers in the garden are at different stages of growth representing the stages of learning for staff and students.

Third Leaf – The Future

This leaf is interwoven with the vines of the Secret Garden, symbolising growth and an expansive vision of education. The vines crossing it represent the connections and experiences that shape each student's journey.

Background: Stones of Time

The mural's background transitions from the warm browns of the convent stones, symbolising history and heritage, to the greys of the building extension, representing progress and modernity. This gradient reflects the journey from our origins to our future, showing how the past supports and shapes our growth.

Hidden Details & School Spirit

Scattered throughout the mural are seven tiny shamrooks, subtle nods to our identity and unity. A playful magpie adds a touch of humour and warmth, recalling the many lunches cheekily stolen from bags by birds over the years. Yet, the bird also carries deeper meaning: it symbolises our students and staff learning, growing wings, and preparing to take flight into their next chapter.

School Motto: Strength in Gentleness

At the top of the mural, our motto "Strength in Gentleness" crowns the artwork, reminding us that true strength lies in compassion, kindness, and quiet resilience. It's a guiding principle that echoes through every brushstroke and symbol. We are deeply grateful to former student, Emilia (Class of 2023) for the extraordinary mural she created as a gift to our school.

Representing the past, present, and future of our community, this artwork is a vibrant reflection of our story and spirit.

Emilia generously gave up countless hours, including weekends, school holidays, and precious time in between her Year 12 studies, to bring this vision to life.

Her dedication, creativity, and love for our school shine through every brushstroke.

This mural will continue to inspire and connect generations of students.


